Quarantine Lifted.
Quarantine officials along the Am-
erican Atlantic seaboard have been
informed that the sea affecting vessels
from Nova Scotia has been removed,
but the rule for all vessels from
Prince Edward Island and Newfound-
land still remains in force.

WANT MANCHURIA AND
MONGOLIA EXCLUDED
Tokio, Friday, August 22 (by the As-
sociated Press).—It is reported that
the meeting yesterday of the Imperial
Cabinet, upholding the opinions ad-
vanced by the military element in the
government, decided to insist upon the
exclusion of Manchuria and Mongo-
lia from the consortium by which the
United States, Great Britain, France
and Japan will assume a dominant po-
sition in the finances of China. It is
said that negotiations will be resumed
with the Powers on that basis.
The Ashi Shimbun says that Vis-
count Uchida, Foreign Minister, spoke
in favor of Japan's unconditional en-
trance into the consortium, explaining
that if Manchuria and Mongolia were
excluded from the scope of the agree-
ment it might be interpreted as show-
ing Japanese designs upon China and
might obstruct loans which are urgent-
ly needed by China. He is reported
to have expressed the belief that such
an impression would be inimical to the
interests of Japan and might place the
nation in a position of complete iso-
lation, adding that on the contrary,
Japan's unconditional adherence would
remove suspicions on the part of China
and the Powers concerning Japan's
supposed aggressiveness as a result of
the acquisition of important interests.
It is understood that leading bank-
ers in London under the impression of
the American proposal, but the mili-
tary groups fear to jeopardize special
political interests in Manchuria and
Mongolia.
