

**EINARSON** Reg. No. 18722, ex-Sgt. Richard Bjorgvin Einarson, 49, died at Ottawa on June 22, 1984. Born December 30, 1934, at Flin Flon, Manitoba, he joined the Force at Winnipeg, Manitoba, on September 3, 1954. After recruit training at Depot he was posted to "A" Division, Protective Sub-Division. In May 1956 he was transferred to "O" Division where he served at Toronto Town Station, Windsor and Sarnia Detachments before being assigned to S & I, Preventive Service, and G.I.S. duties at Toronto. In June of 1960 he was posted to HQ Division for canteen duty until September 1963, when he was transferred to F.S.S. duties in "N" Division and later to "P," "F," and HQ Divisions. He was promoted to corporal on November 1, 1965, and sergeant on October 1, 1975. He had been awarded the Long Service Medal, bronze clasp and star.

**FLETT** Reg. No. S/139, ex-S/Cst. McClure Campbell Flett, 68, died on July 19, 1984, at Norway House, Man. Born on October 24, 1915, at Norway House, Man., he joined the Force as a civilian employee on October 14, 1954, at "D" Division, Norway House Detachment, where he remained throughout his service. He performed guard duties and was also responsible for the maintenance of motor transport vehicles at the detachment. He also acted as a guide and interpreter on police patrols. Before retiring to pension on October 24, 1980, he had been awarded the RCMP Long Service Medal.

**GERRIE** Reg. No. 0.448, Supt. Gordon Alexander Gerrie, (rtd.), 74, died on November 21, 1984, at Victoria, B.C. Born on November 26, 1909, at Winnipeg, Man., he joined the Force as Reg. No. 11787 at Regina, Sask., on November 9, 1932. Following recruit training at Depot, he was posted to "F" Division, where he performed general detachment duties at the following locations: Weyburn, Carlyle, Estevan, Gravelbourg and Tisdale. In March 1936 he was transferred to Regina Town Station, where he enforced the Saskatchewan Liquor Control Act. The following year, he served at Prince Albert Detachment on criminal investigation duties. In December 1942 he was made i/c of St. Walburg Detachment, and was promoted to corporal on November 1, 1943. He also served at Lloydminster, North Battleford and Prince Albert Detachments as NCO i/c. On November 1, 1947, he was promoted to sergeant. In August 1950 he was transferred to "E" Division on temporary duty as Section NCO, Prince Rupert Detachment, and returned to Prince Albert Detachment in November that year. In August 1951 he was transferred to "E" Division as NCO i/c Burnaby Detachment. In May the next year he was promoted to staff sergeant and on March 1, 1954, was appointed sub-inspector. Three months later he was made O.C. New Westminster Sub-Division. He was prom-

oted to the rank of inspector on March 1, 1956. In July 1957 he was transferred to Vancouver Sub-Division HQ and took over command of Victoria Sub-Division a year later. In July 1963 he was transferred to "J" Division, where he assumed the duties of C.I.B. Officer in Fredericton. On April 1, 1965, he was appointed superintendent. The following year he returned to "E" Division, Victoria, as O.C. C.I.B. This was his last posting prior to retirement to pension on June 6, 1968. He had been awarded the Long Service Medal, gold clasp and star.

**GIROUX** Reg. No. S/193, ex-S/Cst. Terrence Gordon Giroux, 30, died on February 11, 1984, near High River, Alta. Born on April 23, 1953, at Driftpile, Alta., he joined the Force at Peace River, in that province, on January 10, 1978, as a reserve special constable. He served at Assumption Detachment, "K" Division, until he resigned from the Force on October 31, 1978.

**GOOD** Reg. No. 17492, ex-Sgt. Reginald Cecil Good, 80, died July 24, 1984, at Qualicum Beach, B.C. Born July 16, 1903, at Vancouver, B.C. he joined the British Columbia Provincial Police as Reg. No. 835 on October 4, 1941, at Victoria, after having been employed as a master mariner by the Pacific Coyle Navigation Co. of Vancouver since 1932. He was posted to the B.C.P.P. "A" Division for duty aboard *P.M.L. 14* berthed at Prince Rupert, and later skippered *P.M.L. 15*, a 65-foot vessel stationed at the same berth. With the amalgamation of the B.C.P.P. and RCMP he joined the Force as a special constable on August 8, 1950, and continued to skipper *M.L.-15* berthed at Prince Rupert. In May of 1955 he was placed in charge of Detachment Class RCMP *Little Bow*; in February of 1958, RCMP *Nanaimo*; in March of 1958, RCMP *Little Bow II*; and in September of 1959 RCMP *Tofino*. He was appointed a regular member, first class constable, on January 1, 1951; promoted to corporal on December 1, 1951; to sergeant on November 1, 1959; and retired to pension on October 3, 1961.

**GRAVES** Reg. No. 12010, ex-Sgt. George William Graves, 78, died on April 1, 1984, at Red Deer, Alta. Born on May 25, 1905, at New Eltham, England, he served with the Alberta Provincial Police for 18 months before it was absorbed by the RCMP on April 1, 1932. He joined the Force on September 16, 1932, at Peace River, Alta., as a special constable, and was assigned night-guard and janitorial duties. He was engaged at Edmonton as a regular member on July 3, 1933, and was sent to Depot for recruit training. He served briefly at "F" Division HQ before being transferred to "K" Division, where he performed general detachment and clerical duties at Lethbridge and Vegreville. He was appointed i/c Hardisty, Westlock, Red Deer Detachment and Town Station,
