**Contract Let**  
The Light Commission held a special meeting yesterday at which the contract for the addition to be built to the gas department was let to Mr. Casper Brann.

**Hearing Application To-day**  
City Solicitor H. J. Sims is in Hamilton to-day where the Dominion Railway Commission is hearing the application of the Grand River Railway for permission to divert its freight line in the south ward.

**From Distant Tennessee**  
Mr. W. V. Utley writes as follows from Cumberland, Tennessee, under date of Oct. 25th: "Reached here Tuesday night. Has been rainy, but good weather came to-day. Temperature about 70 degrees. We are taking daily climbing trips up the mountains and being benefited thereby."

**Assisting in Relief**  
Assistance for relief to sufferers in Poland and the Baltic provinces is being given by the members of St. Matthew's Church. Last evening articles of clothing were received in the basement of the church. These will be forwarded to the far-off countries in the near future.

**At The Meeting.**  
The City is represented today at the meeting of Hydro municipalities representatives which will request that Sir Adam Beck remain at the head of the Hydro Electric Power Commission. Mayor Gross and Ald. Greb are representing the city Council while all the members of the Light Commission except one, Superintendent McIntyre and Secretary S. H. Clark also are in attendance.

**Has 7,186.**  
Official returns from the returning officer of "Southwest" Toronto, seat "A," give H. H. Dewar K. C. Liberal leader a majority of 1,186 over the former Conservative member of the Legislature, George H. Gooderham. Mr. Dewar's total vote was 16,555.

**Windsor after eating houses.**  
Slopelod and unclean eating-houses will not be permitted in Windsor if Dr. J. Adams newly-appointed medical officer of health for the five border municipalities, has anything to say about it. After an inspection by half a dozen of his assistants of cafes and restaurants, Dr. Adams announced his intention of asking the board of health to pass a bylaw at its meeting tomorrow, regulating the sale of food. This bylaw will affect all the adjacent municipalities and is expected to eliminate much of the unsanitary methods now in vogue particularly in the serving of foods.

**Mrs. David Kidd, who is said to be in destitute circumstances, was brought before Magistrate Jelliff at Hamilton recently on information laid by the health department which alleged that the house she occupied was unfit for habitation. The magistrate wrote to David S. Kidd, Byrnes in Toronto, known sometimes as the millionaire preacher, asking him to provide for his wife.**

**A reply has come from Mr. Kidd, Byrnes, stating that he does not feel any obligation in connection with Mrs. Kidd of this city, as she is not his wife. He is reputed to have been left a fortune of about \$9,000,000 by a Chicago man named Byrnes, whose daughter saved from a life of shame it is alleged, and the magistrate wrote asking him to contribute to the support of Mrs. Kidd.**

**Byrnes says the money entrusted to him is to spread the gospel and not to help persons like Mrs. Kidd.**

**The name Byrnes was added that of Kidd at the special request of the man who left the millions, so Mr. Kidd-Byrnes says.**

**London man's tragic death.**  
While visiting his brother J. Limerick at Dover, N. H. Albert B. Limerick of London, Ontario, foreman in a tannery in that city lost his life several years ago, "a chief engineer" at the American Woolen plant at Sawyer's. Yesterday Albert with his little son Carlton visited the engine room of the plant. The little boy wandered dangerously near the fly wheel of the engine and the father, who was fearful for his son's safety, stepped into the path of the wheel in an effort to push his child aside.

**Drawn in by the suction of the wheel or looking in because the Canadian was whirled around the wheel. As soon as it was possible the brother stopped the power. Albert was found to be dead. Physicians called stated that death had come instantly.**

**A wife and mother at Owen Sound, Ontario, also survive. Telegrams were forwarded to Owen Sound late last night in an effort to have his wife hurry to her child's side, the latter having suffered a terrible shock by witnessing his father's tragic death.**

**Not For Hamilton.**

**Only two places were mentioned, Hamilton and Toronto, and when the vote was taken it was a tie. The chairman, Wm. Dryden, of Brooklyn, Ont., voted in favor of Toronto, breaking the tie.**

**Alleged Slayer Remanded.**  
George Jones negro slayer of Mrs. Arthur Oyles, Brantford, faced a charge of murder in the Brantford police court yesterday and was remanded until Thursday. Jones was dazed from the beating he received when he committed his murderous act or feigned lunacy. He failed to answer any of the questions directed to him by the magistrate. At the jail he gave trouble to the officials all night, and a close watch had to be kept on his cell.

**Miller—Howard**  
Miss Olga Howard of Detroit, Mich., daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Howard of Kitchener, was quietly married at Port Huron, Mich., at 12 o'clock Saturday, Oct. 25th to Mr. Ferdinand Miller of Detroit, Mich., son of Dr. and Mrs. Ferdinand Miller of Waterbury, N.Y., and daughter of their wedding took at Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Howard Kitchener, after which they will return to their Detroit home.

**Falls on sharp rod in blacksmith shop.**  
Gordon Taylor, aged 23, son of W. J. Taylor, of Tilbury met with a serious accident in a temporary blacksmith shop on his father's farm in Tilbury East, about three miles west of Tilbury.

**He was standing on a bench about three feet high and leaning against the bench was a sharpened iron rod, projecting above the top about a foot. In jumping from the bench his coat caught the rod and the sharpened end pierced the lower part of the body to a depth of about six inches.**

**He is now in Chatham Hospital and his condition is reported as critical.**

**Dr. Fritch sentenced.**  
An indeterminate sentence of from one to fifteen years was imposed on Dr. George A. Fritch at Detroit following his trial and conviction on charge of manslaughter in connection with the death of Mrs. Victoria Kolenda in a private institution last year.

**An opportunity was given the defendant to appeal, but he told Judge Wilkins he would not take advantage of the offer. The physician was charged with malpractice.**

**Dr. Fritch is a former resident of Drumbo, Ontario, but has been in practice here for the past 20 years. At that time he has been arrested a score of times, always for same offense, but usually escaped punishment.**

**Drowned in cistern.**  
Madge, the four-year old daughter of Mr. M. J. Finnegan, merchant, of Egmondville, was drowned yesterday in a cistern, which had been accidentally left uncovered at the family home.
