Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence,

The House, according to Order, was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting Corrupt Practices in Municipal Affairs."

## (In the Committee.)

After some time the House was resumed, and The Honorable Mr. Botsford, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the House without any amendment.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Abbott, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Mont-

gomery, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be now read a third time. The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly. The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, to which they desire their concurrence.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act to amend the Railway Act" was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. McCallum, seconded by the Honorable Mr.

Sullivan, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be referred to the Committee on Railways, Telegraphs and Harbors.

The Honorable Mr. Abbott presented to the House, a Bill intituled: "An Act to permit the conditional release of First Offenders in certain cases."

The said Bill was read a first time.

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a second time on Monday next.

Then, on motion of the Honorable Mr. Abbott, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Montgomery,

The House adjourned.
