And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That an Act, made in the Twentieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for repealing the Duties payable upon Pot and Pearl Ashes, Wood and Weed Ashes, imported into *Great Britain*, and for granting other Duties in lieu thereof, for a limited Time, which was to continue in Force until the Thirtieth Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-three; and which, by another Act, made in the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, was further continued until the Thirtieth Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-six, shall be, and the same is hereby further continued, from the Expiration thereof, until the Thirtieth Day of May, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine.
