I deem it advisable to notify you thus early because I think it essential that candidates should be chosen as quckly as possible for all the English speaking seats in this City. I think we should also get our candidates elected as quickly as possible for all of the Province of Quebec.

I esteemed it a great privilege to have been a colleague with you in the Union Government under the Right Hon. Sir Robert Borden during the last strenuous years of the war and the none the less troublesome times after the war, when the Government had the big problems of demobilization and reconstruction to deal with. I will also cherish with the greatest pleasure the year that I had the honour and privilege of serving under you as Prime Minister.

I will always be only too happy to do anything I can to assist the Conservative party and yourself to secure an early, well deserved victory, and remain, with kindest regards,
