In reference to previous correspondence regarding the dressmaking charts asked for for the Duck Lake Boarding School I beg to say that the Department is in receipt of a communication from Mr. J. N. Lemire, Montreal, stating that six sets of these charts have been forwarded to your address by express. If you have received them I would like you to be good enough to certify the enclosed account, in duplicate, and return the same to the Department with as little delay as possible so that payment may be made.

It is not considered advisable, owing to the unsettled question with the Province, as to title to take a survey of the portion of the Reserve applied for, it was deemed decided to give Mr. Snodgrass authority under section 28 of the Indian Act to continue at the pleasure of the Department in occupation of the land on which his buildings were erected. If Mr. Ritchie has acquired Review of Mr. Snodgrass in the buildings in question, of no objection thereto and the Indians and Duck Lake Boarding School, granted to Mr. Snodgrass may be used in the buildings in question.
