
Ottawa, March 16th., 1911.

Right Reverend Sir,-

I have the honour to enclose herewith Three Agreements, in duplicate, between Your Lordship and His Majesty the King, represented by the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs, for the future maintenance and management of the Cowessan, Muscowequan's, and Keeseehouse Boarding Schools, and I have to request that you will be good enough to sign these documents in the presence of a subscribing witness and affix your official Seal, returning same to the Department at your earliest convenience, as the Agreements will go into effect on the 1st. of April next.

On the return of these documents the signature of the Deputy Superintendent General will be affixed, and a copy of each will then be sent you. Certain alterations and improvements may be necessary to bring the buildings at these three Schools up to the required standard. An officer of the Department has been instructed to inspect and report on the improvements required at these Schools. A reasonable time will be granted by the Department to allow you to have the necessary improvements made, and in the meantime, provided these Agreements are completed, the increased grant will be paid from the 1st. of April next.
