A New Record

Word has just been received that a new record has been established by Latta Pielje Canner, who put her Holstein cow owned by Mary Abie Steves, Stevenson, B.C. This heifer produced 20.98 lbs. fat and 38,725 lbs. estimated butter in 7 days. This is the second largest record of merit made by a cow in Canada of any age.

Mr. Ryan also took Shevallon Mansel bred from Mansel, the same figure. She is a half-sister to a cow purchased by Mr. Ryan at the Hunter sale a year ago, which held fair to establish a new record for the breed, having produced 7,398 lbs. of milk and 312.5 lbs. of butter in four months.

The Bradford Farms paid Mr. Ness \$1,100 for Redhills Nameless Charm, a two-year-old heifer that was a winner as a yearling last year at a number of the Scotch show. The buyer paid \$1,000 for Stockerton Primrose 3rd, sold by Hector Gordon, a nine-year-old cow, possessing Ayrshire type and dairy conformation.

General Notes

The sale throughout was well managed. It was held in the strongest points of Fair Grounds, and most of the crowd seated. The auctioneer was assisted by J. H. Howland, who conducted the Hunter sale so successfully a year ago. The eighty-eight animals were sold in two hours. Compare this with the 122 animals at Woodstock, Ont., which lasted from a quarter after one till a quarter to seven.

The high prices for strong points of the auctioneer is that he keeps things moving, wasting no time. There was only one regrettable feature about his work, and that was his belittling allusion to the stein cattle, which he presumably considered as fat, but which were quite much more than fat animals.
