Lieut.-Col. Frank Bond, of Montreal, a son of the late Archbishop Bond, died in that city on November 22nd, aged 78. His widow and four children survive him.

He was for many years one of the wardens of St. George's, Newcastle, Ont. His son, Rev. R. W. Allen, M.A., is the Rector of Brampton. The funeral took place at St. George's, Newcastle.

The marriage of the Rev. Leonard A. Dixon, O.B.E., and Miss Margaret Helmer, took place in Wycliffe College Chapel, Toronto, on November 27th. Canon Dixon, Rector of Trinity Church, Toronto, the father of the bridegroom, officiated, assisted by Rev. Canon O'Meara, Principal of Wycliffe College. Mr. and Mrs. Dixon will leave shortly for India, where Mr. Dixon has done such splendid work in the army and Y.M.C.A.

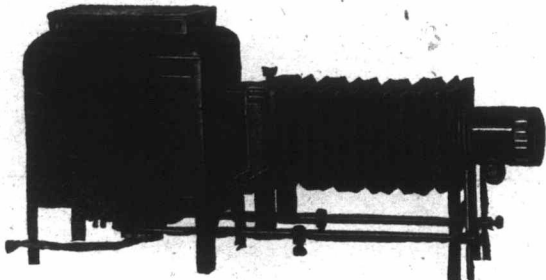
