# The Farmers' Market

## WINNIPEG MARKET LETTER

(Office of The Grain Growers' Grain Company Limited, March 5, 1917)

**Wheat**—Saturday's closing prices show an advance of \$1 cent for May futures, \$1 cent for July and \$1 for October. These gains have all been made during the last four days and several causes influenced the markets in the advance. There has been some good buying in the various wheat markets, a keen demand for wheat at the seaboard and for spot wheat in store terminal elevators. The railroad congestion appeared to be showing signs of improvement, altho it is very slow. Conditions in the winter wheat areas were bad on account of lack of moisture, but as this has been remedied by snowfalls it can not now be taken as a bullish factor. The probability of the arming of American merchant ships was also considered as a bullish argument, in as much as it would have a tendency to promote the forwarding of freight and the report that Britain was bidding fancy prices for neutral tonnage was considered in the same light. On Thursday the U.S. government will issue an estimate of the farm reserves, but such report is always discounted and has little influence when issued unless there is a radical change from what was anticipated.

**Coarse Grains**—Oats and barley prices have advanced also and an excellent cash demand for the former is a feature. High prices of American corn would indicate that this demand is likely to continue.
