ONONDAGA COUNCIL

Middleport, June 23. The Council met this day pursuant to the call of the reeve. All the members were present. The Reeve in the chair. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Council adjourned that the members thereof might form a Court of Revision in regard to the Bell Telephone Co. and Dunnville Co. judgment having been reserved from June 23rd. The appeals were allowed under the provisions of sub-section 3 of Section 14 of the Assessment Act of 1904. Council resumed.

The following accounts were found correct, the Reeve issuing his order on the treasurer for payment of same: Mickle Dymont account for lumber for Fairchild's Creek bridge \$11,409; C. N. Marshall, 22 feet of 24 in galvanized tile \$3.50; G. T. Freight \$3.70; H. G. Avey, lumber for Bateman bridge, \$15.6; Brantford Courier, \$81.70; Schultz Bros, lumber for Deagle Culvert, \$8.32; Martin Bros, 715 lbs. reinforcing iron \$11.45; Huffman blacksmith account, \$1,251; American Road Machinery Co., account \$30; Returning Officer, voting on by-law, \$12; Treasurer of Onondaga Improvement Society \$20.

Moved by Mr. Rose, seconded by Mr. Mansfield: that the by-law for the issue of debentures for the sum of \$7,500, having had its first and second readings on the 19th day of May, and having received the assent of the electors in the vote taken on the 16th of June, be now read a third time, and formally passed, being numbered 240. Carried.

On motion the council adjourned to meet at same place on June 25th at 6.30 p.m.

A by-law for the purpose of borrowing \$4,500 to meet the next current expenditures of the township was read the first, second and third time, passed and numbered 241.

With becoming dignity the monster Hamburg-American liner Emperor, which, by the way, is pronounced Im-pe-ra-tor, docked at pier 1, in Hoboken. Here are some of the striking features of the Emperor—measures 919 feet in length over all, 98 feet beam and has a gross tonnage of 50,000. Her bridge is 90 feet above the water and her masts 246 feet. Funnels extend 60 feet above upper decks, with openings 32 feet in length by 18 in width. Her contract speed is 22 1/2 knots an hour. Has a commodore, four captains and a crew of 1,180. Has a Turkish, electric, mineral and needle baths and a Roman bath in marble and bronze 65 by 41 feet. Wireless can transmit messages 1,500 miles and she carries three operators. Among the distinguished passengers on her maiden trip were Rear Admiral Herbert Winslow, Miss Helen Stevenson, Mrs. James Stevenson and Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Walker.
