

EDUCATIONAL REFORM THE NEED OF THE HOUR!

was estainsted in this Province by the administration of the Hon. Dr. Charles Tupper, in 1864.

The passing of the Free School Act of that year marked a great epoch in the history of Nova Scotia. In its frank recognition of the duty of the state of care for the pagaciton of all classes of the people, rich and poor, Nova Scotia's Free School Act was one of the pioneer measures of reform in the British world.

But it is obvious that a syst of public instruction which met the needs of Nova Scotians in 1864, falls short of the requirements of 1916. In the past half century the history of education the world over has been of steady development to meet new conditions. But the governments of Nova Scotia has been content to mark time. For thirty-thirty-four years the schools of this Province have been administered by liberal governments. For 20 years they have been in the hands of the Hon. George H. Murray and his associates. Throughout this entire period there has been no intelligent attempt to modernize or improve the system of 1864 or to adapt its administration to present day conditions.
