DIOCESAN LIMITS MAY BE CHANGED

APPROACHING PROVINCIAL SYNOD WILL CONSIDER MANY IMPORTANT QUESTIONS

From Tuesday's Morning Leader

The Provincial Synod of Rupert's Land which opens in Regina tomorrow promises in many respects to be one of the most important ecclesiastical gatherings ever held in the west. Important matters closely affecting the various dioceses comprising within the synod will be brought forward for discussion.

While the diocesan synods meet annually, the Provincial Synod meets triennially, and the approach of the Provincial Synod of Rupert's Land in this city for ten years, would not have been held until next year, the last one having been held at Calgary two years ago. On that occasion, however, certain important questions came up for consideration which were not finally dealt with and which were held over to be discussed at a synod to be held in two years.

The Provincial Synod of Rupert's Land is made up of representatives of the dioceses of the province, comprising it, viz.: Kewatin, Selkirk, Rupert's Land, Qu'Appelle, Saskatchewan, Calgary, McKenzie River, Athabasca, and Moose Jaw.

The opening service of the synod will be held in St. Paul's church at 10 a. m. on Wednesday morning, the 14th inst. The synod will take place at St. Paul's school house on the afternoon of the same day at 2 p. m. The following morning, the 15th, a special service and celebration of the Holy Communion will be held at 7 a. m.

Reorganization of Diocesan Boundaries
 The first matter down for consideration in the agenda paper is the reorganization of the dioceses of the province. The Bishop of Qu'Appelle, calling as it does for a sufficient number of assistant bishops under section IX of the constitution of the Provincial Synod. This question was first brought up at Calgary two years ago, when it was decided to postpone action in the matter until the present meeting of the synod. A notice of motion by the Ven. Archbishop Lloyd calling for the "reorganization of diocesan boundaries in the ecclesiastical Province of Rupert's Land" will necessarily have an important bearing upon the application of the Bishop of Qu'Appelle, calling as it does for several changes in the boundaries of several of the dioceses which, if carried out, would have the effect of materially reducing the size of the present diocese of Qu'Appelle, thus lessening the necessity now exists for an assistant bishop.
