Peace Delegates In - Session Today But No Progress Made

Counter Proposals Put Forward By the Ottoman Government Quite Unacceptable To Allies and Turkish Envoys Must Again Confer With Government At Constantinople

London, Dec. 28-The peace envoys representing the Balkan allies and the Turkish empire m et again in St. James palace today and after an hour and a half's discussion decided on a further adjournment until four o'clock on Monday afternoon.

The delegates of Bulgaria, Greece, Montenegro, Servia and Turkey gathered at eleven o'clock. It was the turn of the Turks to preside and Rechad Pasha took the chair.


