How to Pack Parcels for Soldiers

The post office department gives out the following:

Green's shop. The public is urged to exercise every care in packing parcels for the troops, as careful packing is essential to ensure delivery of the parcel in good condition.

Parcels sent abroad require higher standard of packing than is necessary in the Canadian parcel post, and this applies with even greater force to parcels for the troops. Those which are inlequately packed run great risk of damage or loss of contents,

Thin cardboard boxes, such as shoe boxes and thin wooden boxes should not be used; nor does a single sheet of ordinary brown paper afford sufficient protection. The following forms of packing are recommended :

1. Strong double cardboard boxes, preferably those made of corrugated cardboard, and having lids which completely enclose the sides of the boxes.

2. Strong wooden boxes. 3. Several folds of stout pack-

4. Additional security is afforded by an outer covering of linen, calico or canvas, which should be securely sewn up.

The address of the parcel should be written in ink on the cover perferably in two places.

The address of the sender of the parcel should also be stated in order that it may be returned if undeliverable. The contents of the parcel should be stated in writing on the cover.

In the case of parcels sent to the Mediterranean force, they should be very strongly packed. They should be as nearly round as possible, and well padded with shavings, crumpled paper, or similar protective material. The outer covering should consist of strong linen, calico or canvas, and should be securely sewn up. The use of wooden or metal boxes with square corners are undesirable as they are liable to injure other parcels in transit. No parishable articles should be sent, and anything likely to become soft or sticky, such as chocolates, should be enclosed in tins. Percels merely wrapped in paper or packed in thin cardboard boxes. such as shoe boxes, cannot be


