LIQUOR PRICES AGAIN ADVANCE

Jump 10 to 12 per cent, and another Increase expected in a Few Days.

Private purchasers of liquor who are holding back in the hope of buying high-class whiskies at slaughter prices just before prohibition comes into effect on October 1st will probably be disappointed. Imported liquors took a 10 to 12 per cent. advance within the past few days and are due for another increase with in the next two or three weeks it was intimated today.
