For storing celery for family use, where only a few hundred roots are wanted, a trench should be dug out wide enough to admit three rows of roots, and deep enough so that the earth will cover the stalks almost to the tops when drawn up to them, leaving a slight bank at either side. Cover the leaves with two boards, placed like the saddle-boards of a roof, supporting them in the middle by stakes four feet spart, driven down among the roots along the middle of the trench, and sawed off in line at the height of the
