

Are Your Eyes Weak?

How you may know when Glasses should first be used and those in use abandoned:

1st-If you are obliged to move small objects further from the eye in order to see distinctly. 2nd-If you find it necessary to place the light between the eyes and the object. 3rd-If, when considering a near object, it appears to have a kind of mist before it.

4th-If the letters of a book run together, or seem blurred or double. 5th-If the eyes are fatigued by close exercise, and you are obliged to relieve them by

6th-If black spots appear before the eyes or seem floating around them.
