No. 295.—Code Telegram from Secretary of State. (Received June 30th, 1916).

Question having been raised whether British subjects ordinarily resident in Great Britain but at present living abroad should return to enlist, Army Council would be glad if it can be made known as widely as possible that they do not intend at present that the provisions of Military Service Acts should be enforced in respect of persons liable for service under these Acts who are at present residing in His Majesty's Overseas Dominions, and that while every endeavour will be made to utilize the services of such persons should they return, they must do so at their own risk and expense.

A Matter for the Board of Trade.

Editor Evening Telegram.
 Dear Sir,—A rather serious situation has arisen lately, affecting particularly fishermen who have gone into the business of refining cod-liver oil. A great deal of expenditure has been made in fitting up the Plant, etc., necessary for the work and oil has been purchased and refined. Now I learn that recently the merchants as if by common consent are refusing to purchase this refined oil. I hear that it is a concerted action on their part and it looks very much like a combine, which is of course a very objectionable feature. Now we all have a common interest in our produce. It is to the mutual benefit of merchant and fisherman that there should be co-operation in marketing our produce.
 Therefore I hold that this action of the merchants is one which is inimical to the best interests of the Colony and that something should be done, and at once, to relieve the situation and break this deadlock between merchant and fisherman.
 The Board of Trade is constituted in the interest of our Trade. It lives, or should live, not for our merchants but for our workers and all producers of our wealth. If the merchants will not act, I commend this oil situation to the Board of Trade and ask for a prompt solution.
