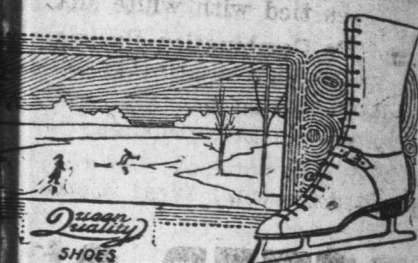

"Starboard" to Go

FOR 'RIGHT' ON MERCHANT SHIPS.

Captain C. A. McAllister, Secretary
of the Navigation Laws Revision
Committee of the United States Ship-
ping Board, said recently that the
traditional sea terms of "starboard"
and "port" may soon be changed to
"right" and "left," respectively, in the
American merchant marine. The com-
mittee will act on the matter shortly.The reason for seeking this change
is that American boys are entering the
life on the ocean as they have never
done before, and the strange words
work a great deal of confusion to
young men reared in the corn and
wheat fields of the Middle West, or,
in fact, any part of the country.The words "starboard" and "port"
were discarded on the ships of the
United States Navy a number of years
ago by Secretary Daniels, who then re-
ceived a great deal of adverse criti-
cism, but the shippers are now gradu-
ally coming around to his point of
view. Captain McAllister said.—N. Y.

Why Viz. and Oz?

Do you know what these everyday
signs mean, and their origin?Viz. is the first two letters of vide-
licet, a Latin word meaning "name-
ly." The a is a corruption of an an-
cient sign, something like a 3, that
was placed at the end of the abbrevi-
ated word, in course of time this 3
has become z.The same thing applies to oz, the
abbreviation for ounce.The letters lb., standing for pounds
in weight, are the first and third of
the Latin word libra.Cwt. (hundredweight) and dwt.
(pennyweight) are also abbreviations
of Latin words. C is the Latin nume-
ral for a hundred, d the first letter of
denarius (penny), and wt is short for
the word "weight."Account current is written a.c.
L. s. d. are the first letters of libra,
solidi, and denarii, all Latin words,
meaning pounds, shillings, and pence.
Sic. meaning "literally," idem,
meaning "as before stated," and thid,
meaning "in the same place," are also
from the Latin.

Microbe Methuselahs.

Is it possible that the latest scienti-
fic discovery may bring a return of
the Egyptian plagues or the Black
Death—the most terrible epidemics in
the history of the world?The question arises from the an-
nouncement of Dr. Galipio, of the
French Academy of Science, that in
Egyptian papyrus (manuscripts)
twenty centuries and more old, he has
found living micro-organisms. He
cites this as the most remarkable dis-
covery to which his investigations
have led, although it is equally true
of documents dating back, for in-
stance, to the Middle Ages.Modern hygienic conditions, of
course, are vastly different to those
of the early Egyptian days or Middle
Ages, but there is a possibility that
those germs of centuries ago might
convey the old plagues.For they are very much alive! The
microbes discovered by Dr. Galipio
were subjected to the usual test of
heat, and although the temperature
was carried to 245 degrees Fahren-
heit, they hopped about like two-year-
olds in spite of their 2,000 years.

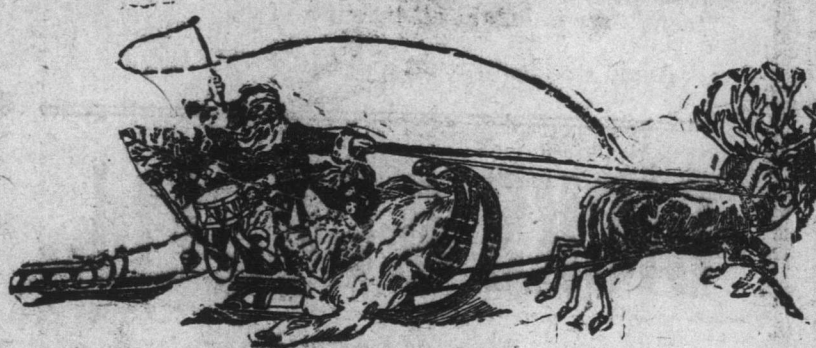

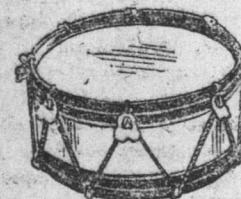

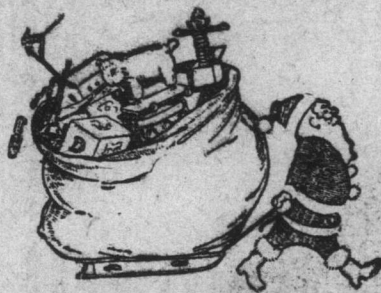
