

Editor Evening Telegr Dear Sir.-A certain correspondent of the "Western Star" writing of the situation developed in July last as the result of Premier Warren's demand for an investigation into the charges made against certain members of the Government of which he had been Minister of Justice, said in part of the Prime Minister: "Oppor tunity knocks sometime at ever man's door. It has knocked lately at the door of the Premier of this country who quickly answered the summons and throwing the portal wide open stepped out and swiftly followed along the path whither duty called him. If he carry on he will find at its end a pedestal whereupon his countrymen will elevate him and there maintain him in justifica tion and honour while and so long as he and his colleagues in the ministry shall adopt as their motto in the government of the country and practice it: "Let justice be done though the heavens should fall."

While the end is not yet, Premier Warren is "carrying on" alright as shown by the public despatch, and is looks now as if right and truth and justice were going to have a chance to function in this country notwithstanding the powerful efforts made to strangle them at their renaissance It is no easy task to which Premier Warren has set his hand for the clean-up to be effective must be thorough. No consideration of political exigency, corporation influence or private friendship should be allowed to weigh against restoration of honesty in the public service, neither should official prejudice or personal dislike be permitted to stand in the way of ever-handed justice being extended to the lowest subordinate in the Public Service who has a bona fide cause for complaint, whether of injustice, discrimination or what not. I am, sir.
