

**Danger and Caution
Signals to be Uniform**

Local Governments Endorse Resolutions of Highway Officials Who Held Conference at Winnipeg.

Interprovincial Conference of Highway Officials held in conjunction with the Canadian Good Roads Convention, unanimously adopted a resolution, unconditionally adopted a resolution of caution and danger on public roads. All the provinces have adopted them. The Western Provinces have adopted them. The Eastern Provinces have adopted them. The conference was held at St. John's, Nfld., on June 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 1923. A further conference of Highway Officials and Highway Engineers will be held to discuss matters of uniformity regarding the use of the highways and the standardization of department on uniformity with a view to securing efficiency and economy. The symbols will not be less than 18 inches in width, tapering off to an arrow, painted black on a background of white. The sign shall be erected on posts on the right side of the highway so that the top of the sign shall be not less than 6 feet or more than six and a half feet from the level of the travel. The sign shall be placed at a distance of 200 feet from the highway. They will face approaching traffic at right angles with the edge of the road. The sign shall be placed at a distance of 200 feet from the point of view, in cases where the local surface will not permit of the sign being placed at this distance, the sign shall not be less than 300 feet from the highway. A special sign bearing the words "Narrow Bridge" placed at a distance of 200 feet, will warn vehicles of a narrow bridge of a highway. The conference also favored the use of a white line four feet wide to be placed at a distance of 200 feet from the point of view, in cases where the local surface will not permit of the sign being placed at this distance, the sign shall not be less than 300 feet from the highway. The Premier's Task

Editor Evening Telegram.

Dear Sir--A certain correspondent of the "Western Star" writing of the situation developed in July last as the result of Premier Warren's demand for an investigation into the charges made against certain members of the Government of which he had been Minister of Justice, said in part of the Prime Minister: "Opportunity knocks sometime at every man's door. It has knocked lately at the door of the Premier of this country who quickly answered the summons and throwing the portal wide open stepped out and swiftly followed along the path whither duty called him. If he carry on he will find at its end a pedestal whereupon his countrymen will elevate him and there maintain him in justification and honour while and so long as he and his colleagues in the ministry shall adopt as their motto in the government of the country and practice it: "Let justice be done though the heavens should fall."

While the end is not yet, Premier Warren is "carrying on" alright as shown by the public despatch, and it looks now as if right and truth and justice were going to have a chance to function in this country notwithstanding the powerful efforts made to strangle them at their renaissance. It is no easy task to which Premier Warren has set his hand for the clean-up to be effective must be thorough. No consideration of political expediency, corporation influence or private friendship should be allowed to weigh against restoration of honesty in the public service, neither should official prejudice or personal dislike be permitted to stand in the way of ever-handed justice being extended to the lowest subordinate in the Public Service who has a bona fide cause for complaint, whether of injustice, discrimination or what not. PIRACY ON CANTON RIVER.

HONG KONG, April 13. A large party of Chinese passengers on board the steamer Tai Lee, bound from Kong Moon to Hong Kong, were fired on and robbed in the Canton River delta Friday night in the first piratical attack since the promulgation of new anti-piratical regulations. She was accompanied by a steamer running under the new convoy system. The pirates, posing as passengers, invaded the engine room, while confederates on the bank opened fire. The robbers ordered the engines stopped. While special guards and European officers were returning the fire of the pirates ashore numbers of the gang on board robbed the passengers and ransacked the quarters. Several passengers were wounded.
