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Davies Pleads Not Guilty;

Preliminary Hearing Begins

Man Accused of Assaulting and Robbing Joseph Wil-

kinson at Crumlin Some Days Ago, Appeared

Before Squire Chittick This Afternoon.

The preliminary hearing of Jos.

Davies, the farm laborer, charged with

robbing Jos. Wilkinson, a West Nis-

sour farmer and thresher, near

Crumlin, and also with fraud, pre-

ferred before Squire Chittick at the court

house this afternoon. When arraigned

Davies pleaded not guilty, and the

case was opened. Crown Attorney Mc-

Killop represented the crown. Davies

had no lawyer.

It was remembered that on the

evening of Nov. 15, Joseph Wilkinson

was assaulted and robbed near his

residence, the sum of \$175 being taken

from him. The county constables in-

vestigated, and Davies was arrested in

the city, charged with the crime.

The charge of fraud is the outcome

of other transactions between the men.
