

MAN PRINCE SEEKING RELEASED FROM JAIL

Mother Claims Son Under Arrest Is Man Wales Would Locate.

Huntington, W. Va., Sept. 5.—News despatches containing the information that the Prince of Wales had expressed a desire to locate "Edwin A. James, an aviator," while in the United States, referred to her son, Clifford A. James, a former lieutenant in the British royal air force. Mrs. J. A. James of this city declared tonight.

James was released from Cabell county jail tonight under \$3,000 bail, having been charged with embezzlement in connection with the disposal of a quantity of diamonds. According to Mrs. James, her son will not seek to meet the prince until his legal difficulties are adjusted.

James was among the aviators who guarded London during the air raids. Mrs. James said.

BRITISH TRADES UNION UPHOLDS MACDONALD

Congress Strongly Supports Premier's Activities in Favor of Arbitration.

Hull, England, Sept. 5.—The British Trades Union Congress in session here today aligned itself strongly in support of Premier MacDonald's activities at Geneva, and also in behalf of the Anglo-Soviet Treaty, which is considered in danger of nullification when it comes before the British parliament at the autumn session through a combination of the antagonistic votes of the Conservative and Liberal parties.

The congress voted that a telegram be sent to Premier MacDonald congratulating him on his speeches in favor of arbitration and disarmament. After discussing how a universal strike of workers could suffice to prevent wars, the congress unanimously carried a resolution emanating from the Miners' Federation, instructing the general council to call a special congress to decide on the industrial action to be taken when war is threatened.

Soviet Russia Doubles Wage For Her Army

Berlin, Sept. 5.—Soviet Russia has just doubled its army pay, with promises of further increases in the near future.

However, the Soviet government has signified its willingness to participate in a conference for reduction of armaments, provided the conference is held outside of Switzerland. It refuses to send representatives into Switzerland until the Swiss government indemnifies the daughter of M. Vorovsky, Russia's emissary at Lausanne, who was assassinated.

TRADE UNION SEEKS MINIMUM FARM WAGE

Congress Passes Resolution To Secure Improved Workers' Conditions.

London, Sept. 5.—The Trade Union Congress at Hull today passed a resolution, which is to be submitted to the agricultural workers' union, in favor of instituting a rural campaign to secure a legal minimum wage that would insure a proper standard of living for farm workers, and to secure a guaranteed working week of 48 hours, as well as other improved conditions for the workers.

The congress voted £1,000 towards a fund for the campaign in behalf of the farm laborers.

TRADE TREATY SIGNED WITH NETHERLANDS

Approval of Parliaments Necessary Before Agreement Becomes Operative.

Ottawa, Sept. 5.—The trade treaty between Canada and the Netherlands, which was signed today by Hon. James A. Robb, acting minister of finance, and Hon. T. A. Low, minister of trade and commerce, on behalf of Canada, and by Consul-General T. H. Demerest of Montreal for the Netherlands, is similar to the treaty now in operation between Canada and France. Under the new treaty there is an exchange of most favored national treatment. Approval of the parliaments in both countries must be obtained before the new agreement becomes operative.
