It was a community in which Saturday afternoon and Sunday are much used by newspaper paders to respond to Want Ads. Thursday set in a heavy r in, which continued throughout Friday and Saturday morning. The Want Ad phones reflected the weather - there were fewer calls and fewer ads. Many classifications for the week-end issues were smaller than usual.

People who might otherwise have inserted Want Ads reasoned that it was poor weather for business. They would insert their messages "next week."

And it came off fair Saturday afternoon, and those keen ones whose Want Ads had been ordered for insertion benefited in consequence—there were as many buyers in the field, there were fewer Want Ad offerings to investigate. Advertisers

sold very readily. There are peculiarities of the weather which obtrude on experienced persons with observation. Thus, wet evenings and Sundays are bad for interviewing advertisers in personthat is obvious. But they are surprisingly good for remaining at home and reading. Usually more people read the Want Ads on rainy evenings and Sundays than on fair ones. This greater number of readers may go a long way to compensate the advertiser for the rainy weather, sometimes actually is a preponderatingly favorable thing.

Out of the larger number of readers, the maximum number of prospects are interested. Many of these call up. I have just examined the Want Ad of an enterprising man. He concluded his rainy day message with this: "Phone me

today. Then, if you're interested further, we'll make an ap-

pointment for fair weather. You, too, can make Want Ads pay in rainy weather. (All Rights Reserved.)
