WASHINGTON, March 29 .- The President WASHINGTON, March 29.—The President sent to the House to-day his veto of the Bland Seigniorage bill. He reviews the financial conditions, and says that the recovery being so well under way nothing should be done to check convalescence. His main objections to the bill are its anfortunate construction, nearly every sentence inviting controversy of construction, and that it will not maintain parity of the two metals.
