The Liberal success in the general elections, held yesterday, was the occasion for great rejoicing in the ranks of the winning party all over Canada.

There were a great many surprises connected by the results in the various provinces. Quebec went strongly against the government, while Ontario, where a regular revolution was predicted, stood by Sir Charles Tupper better than any other section of the country.

Some of the notable defeats are the following: Hon. David Mills in Bothwell, William Paterson in South Brant, A. McNeill in North Brant, the two Conservative candidates in Hamilton, and both Conservative candidates in Ottawa City.

In Quebec, Messrs. Tullon (Postmaster-General), Amers (Procurator of the Crown), and DeJardins (Public Works), all lost their seats.
