## INDIAN WORK.

From Miss Clarke.

CHILLIWACK, B.C., July 16th, 1892.

DEAR MRS. WILLMOTT,—In reviewing the events of the past three months, the camp-meeting stands out as having been the one to create the greatest stir in our own particular circle.

The camp ground is picturesquely situated on the bank of a small stream, which supplies the sojourners in the "tented grove" with an abundant supply of beautiful clear water. The trees, through openings in which may be caught glimpses of the snow-clad mountains beyond, are of the magnificent growth common to the forests of British Columbia. The majority of the "tents" are rough wooden structures, the only canvas ones being about half a dozen occupied by some of the Indians. This living in a wooden house with a good floor in it may not appear very romantic, still it is certainly very comfortable, especially during the wet weather, of which there is usually a good share at camp-meeting time.
