There can be no doubt but the above story has reference to the deluge of Nosh, and that it was derived from the lible. The clidest son all the seventh Manu was Itahicaku. He is said to have been the first, covering who established a kungdom in India. This pride of aniquity, and contempt for the simplicity of truth, is one of the greatest obstacles to the spread of the gospel among the Hindus.
