

Water Commissioners have asked for an appropriation of \$13,000.

FALLBROOK, ONT.—Efforts are being made to induce Donaldson Bros. to rebuild their saw mill.

NANAIMO, B.C.—The council has decided to build a dam at Boulder Creek for an extra supply of water.

CARLTON PLACE, ONT.—The Queen City Oil Co. have made arrangements to erect storage tanks here.

PORT DALHOUSIE, ONT.—The by-law to raise \$6,500 for granolithic sidewalks was defeated on June 26th.

LONGUEUIL, QUE.—The Council has decided to purchase the necessary machines for macadamizing streets.

PERTH, ONT.—The County Council has decided to raise \$65,000 by debentures for the purpose of building roads.

HUNTSVILLE, ONT.—Tenders are requested by the Board of Education up to July 10th for erection of new school.

PRESCOTT, ONT.—W. B. Smellie, town engineer, has recommended the construction of 10-foot granolithic walks.

GODERICH, ONT.—Plans will be prepared immediately for improvements to the Central school, to cost about \$4,000 and to include improved system of heating and plumbing.

WINDSOR, ONT.—The time for receiving tenders for carpentering, plastering, painting, plumbing, heating and roofing of library building has been extended to July 10th.

ORILLIA, ONT.—A by-law will be submitted to the ratepayers to provide by debentures \$18,000 for improving and extending the waterworks system and \$30,000 to cover expenditures on lighting and power plant.

ARNPRIOR, ONT.—T. H. DeCew, of Fenelon Falls, is considering the establishment of a stove factory here.—It is proposed to raise \$10,000 by the issue of debentures for the extension of the waterworks system.

VANCOUVER B. C.—The Vancouver Power Company is calling for tenders for building a road between Westminster Junction and Coquitlam Lake, in connection with the power scheme.—A new hospital on St. Paul's site is proposed, to be three-storeys, brick and stone, cost \$75,000.

BROCKVILLE, ONT.—Robert Bowie, Chairman Light Commissioners, desires tenders by 5th inst. for masonry and concrete work required for erection of new gas holders.—The by-law to assist in the establishment of a hat factory will again be submitted to the ratepayers on July 14th.

TARA, ONT.—Tenders are invited by William Campbell, county commissioner, up to July 12th, for building two concrete abutments and the steel superstructure for a bridge across Snake Creek, on the town line between Arran and Saugeen townships. Plans by R. McDowall, C.E., Owen Sound.

SAULT STE. MARIE, ONT.—The selection of a site for new high school has not yet been settled.—Tenders for post office building to be built here will likely be invited within a fortnight.—The estate of the late Hart A. Massey has offered \$5,000 towards the erection of a \$20,000 Methodist church here.

SPRINGHILL, N. S.—A waterworks system costing \$160,000 is to be constructed. John Galt, C. E. and M. E., of Toronto, is designing and preparing plans and specifications. The water supply will be brought a distance of ten miles, across a long deep valley, requiring special design and construction.

CAMPBELLTON, N.B.—At a meeting of the town council held on June 25th it was decided to increase the electric light system by the addition of another plant equal to or greater than the present plant. The electric light committee was authorized to proceed at once with the arrangements for installation.

NEWCASTLE, N.B.—Tenders are invited by R. C. D. Aitken, town clerk, up to July 15th for constructing a covered concrete and masonry reservoir, and up to July 22nd for a complete electric lighting system, exclusive of boilers. Willis Chipman, C.E., of Toronto, is consulting engineer for the above works.

QUEBEC, QUE.—It is stated that Sir Charles Ross will commence the construction of a small arms factory on the Cove field about August 1st.—The Harbor Commissioners held a meeting last week to consider the proposed St. Lawrence route improvements. It is proposed to erect a lighthouse on the west end of the Island of Orleans and a permanent pier at Point St. Roch.

GUELPH, ONT.—Tenders will likely be invited immediately for the MacDonald building in connection with the Ontario Agricultural College.—Plans have just been prepared by secretary Westervelt, of the Provincial Winter Fair, for important additions and enlargements.
