ON the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Customs, and under the provisions of the Act respecting the Customs, Section 4, intituled "An Act respecting the Customs," His Excellency has been pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Port of *Perce*, now under the Survey of the Port of *Quebec*, in the Province of *Quebec*, shall be and the same is hereby constituted and created into a Port of Entry and a Warehouse Port for all the purposes of the said Act under the name of "The Port of *Perce*." **WM. 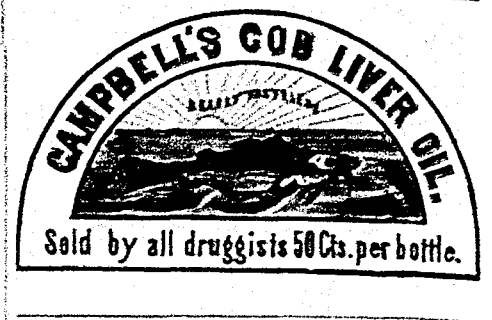
