THE VOICE OF SCRIPTURE ON MISSIONARY WORK.

1. The Ground of Missionary Work-God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoesoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.—John iii. 16. Good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people.—Luke ii. 10. Go ye into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature .-Mark xvi. 15.
