

FACTORS WHICH MIGHT BE TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT FOR LOWER THRESHOLDS OF  
CERTAIN SCHEDULE 2 CHEMICALS

1. An assessment of what constitutes a militarily significant quantity of the chemical.
2. The effective dose of the chemical, or some function of it.
3. Whether the chemical has previously been produced, stockpiled or used as a chemical weapon.

1. Article XIV of the Convention:

It is the understanding of the Committee that the competence of existing international administrative tribunals (United Nations Administrative Tribunal or International Labour Office Administrative Tribunal) for staff disputes might be referred, subject to the rules of relevant organizations, through an appropriate resolution of the Conference of States Parties.
