- Assistance focuses on human resources development and increasing Malaysia's access to Canadian technology and expertise in support of private-sector development, infrastructure services, environmental management, and women in development. Official development assistance funding in 1994-95 totalled \$8.4 million.
- A key Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) project is Enterprise Malaysia-Canada, which fosters joint ventures and other commercial collaboration between Canadian and Malaysian firms by matching Malaysian needs to Canadian capabilities in such areas as oil and gas, information technology, environmental services, water and sanitation, and manufacturing.
- Since 1982, CIDA's Industrial Co-operation (INC) program has provided more than \$16 million to support Canadian businesses assisting in Malaysian private-sector development. Funds have been mainly for viability, starter and preliminary studies in industry, energy, transportation, agriculture, water and sanitation. CIDA-INC seed money has led to many successful joint ventures that have produced commercial benefits for both Canadian and Malaysian firms.
