

Church Society, in consequence of the following resolution of the Synod of the Diocese :

"That it is desirable to have but one Fund for Algoma, to be entitled 'The Algoma Diocesan Fund,' the first charge upon which shall be the quota which this Diocese is pledged to contribute towards the Episcopal Stipend, the balance to be sent to the Bishop of Algoma, to be by him applied to the general missionary work in his diocese, or to any particular parts of the missionary work therein, as the donors shall direct."

The Reverend John Walters, Rector of Levis, who for the past two years has zealously discharged the duties of Secretary and Treasurer, having resigned the position, the Rev. George Hamilton, M.A., has kindly undertaken the task of Secretary, with Mr. George Veasey as Treasurer. All amounts, therefore, forwarded through the above channel, will be duly acknowledged in the monetary pages of the Society's report.

A sum of \$569 has been forwarded to the Bishop for missionary work, and \$62.60 to the Rev. E. F. Wilson for the Indian homes.

The regular quota of \$300 has been duly paid to the Episcopal Fund. The Rev. T. H. Appleby, of Saule Ste. Marie, while amongst us in October, collected the handsome sum of \$358 for special work in his parish, thus giving a total of \$1289.60 forwarded to the Diocese of Algoma during 1877.

The Bishop of that Diocese recently gave at Sherbrooke and Quebec a very full and interesting account of the work he had in hand; and churchmen may well be urged to help liberally the good work of spreading the knowledge of the gospel in this missionary diocese of the Canadian Church.
