The System is the same as proposed at St. Jérôme

Mr. Owen's two criticisms

The remarks that the Honorable Minister of Colonization made in the House are the same that he made at the Colonization Congress at St. Jérôme.

The same applies to my utterances on the two occasions.

After the Congress, the proceedings of which are reported in all our Daily Papers, the Pulp and Paper Magazine of Toronto and Montreal commented on the whole as follows:

« You will probably have noticed in « the papers lately the Report of a Coloniza-« tion Congress, held at St. Jérôme. Various « suggestions were made by the speakers, « tending to minimize or altogether do away « with the socalled friction between the Lumb-« ermen and the Settlers, Mr. Kelly, M. P. P. « for Bonaventure, suggests that a certain Re-« serve of cultivable lands should be made for
