

the duty of the latter commences.—

3. The Visitors shall inspect both Schools during School hours at least once a week, and if only once, on Friday or Saturday; when they shall receive Reports from the Master and Mistress, of the Conduct of the children, and of their attendance at Church and School—examine the work of the Girls, inspect the “Registers of individual proficiency,” and the *marked books* of the Teachers—commend or censure the children according to their deserts, with a particular reference to the regularity of their attendance, and, if they see good, put questions to them in their lessons.
4. The Visitors shall direct the infliction of Punishment if any case is referred to them—and, if they are at a loss, shall refer it to the Minister of the Parish, or his Assistant, or to the Secretary of the Diocesan Committee.
5. The Visitors shall deliver the weekly reports to one of the persons mentioned in the preceding rule, to whom they shall also represent the state of the children’s appearance and deportment, and, upon the last day of their visiting the school, at the end of their month, shall distribute Prize-tickets, specifying the nature and degree of Merit for which they are given, which Prize tickets, unless forfeited by subsequent misconduct, or amounting to a number too inconsiderable, shall entitle the holder of them, at every Public Examination, to a proportionable reward.
6. The School shall be visited every Sunday before Morning Service, either by the Visitors, or by the Minister of the Parish, and the persons so visiting shall put questions to those Children, who attend on Sundays only, in the general subjects of their instruction—and to the other children in their religious instruction.
