## DRESSMEN HOLD STORM SESSION

Strong Kick Put Over Non-Payment of Dues and Other Grievances.

The monthly assessment levied by the International Union on all printers has stirred up more strife in union ranks than the officers of the body ever believed possible. This was clearly, as well as forcibly, shown at the meeting of the Webb Dressmen last night, in the Labor Temple, when many members stood up and addressed remarks to the chair as to what they thought about the taxation of 35 cents a month. The slogan appeared to be, "They don't do it down in the States, and for that reason the members object to paying the money. A general kick was also put up over the non-payment of dues. It appears that many of the men are far behind in their dues, and the dues have been refused to be paid."

The chief question discussed was whether part of the men would remain members of the National rankers and the other branches of the union are clinging to the hope that the typographers will reconsider their decision and stand by them as of old, but it is just possible that the men may be effected by the National men may prevent any welding of the trade together.

## NEGRO REBELS THREATEN CUBA

Serious Uprising Stirrs Government to Prompt Action—Insurgents Demand Rewards for Services.

HAVANA, May 20.—(Can. Press.)—There is no room for doubt to-night of the existence of a negro conspiracy, extending to all the provinces of the island, with the apparent intention of taking up arms against the government to-day, which is the tenth anniversary of Cuban independence. The negroes appear to have been roused to rebellion by the denial of what seems to them their just political rewards for services rendered in the war of independence, in which they constituted a great majority of the Cuban forces.
