NO SUNDAY LEGISLATION
PREMIER ELLS ALLIANCE

Not Advisable This Session Owing to Pending References to the Privy Council.

The executive board of the Ontario Lord's Day Alliance met yesterday with members present from all parts of the province. The chair was occupied by Rev. Dr. Chown. J. K. MacDonald was elected to succeed the late Rev. Dr. Caven.

The premier sent the following letter to the alliance concerning the passage of any legislation by the legislature during the present session: "I am directed to say that in view of the double whammy as to the jurisdiction of the province with respect to Sunday legislation it is not thought that it will be expedient to bring before the legislature at the present session."

"As you are aware certain questions were referred to the supreme court of Canada, and it is understood that the intention of the Dominion government to carry the case to the privy council. Under these circumstances it is thought that it will be most expedient to wait until the appeal to the privy council has been decided before passing any further legislation."

The attorney-general of Ontario has, however, decided to unite with the minister of justice in the application to the privy council for leave to appeal against their opinion in the supreme court case.

Emphasis was placed upon the observance of Lord's day, Sunday, April 23, which is now quite generally observed throughout the Anglo-Saxon world. In many places the existence of a branch has secured the stopping of certain vehicles carrying on their work on that day was carefully considered and referred to the legal committee. Figures Brought Down in Legislature Show Remarkable Discrepancy—Routine Work.

Before separating for the week's holidays the legislature made rapid progress with the routine work outlined on the order paper.
