NEW LICENSE COMMISSION McNAUGHT IS CHAIRMAN

Ex-Ald. Defoe and Dr. Wilson His Associates—Fearless Administration Promised.

W. K. McNaught (chairman), Dr. R. J. Wilson of Bloor-street and Daniel J. Defoe, are the new license commissioners for Toronto, appointed by the government, to succeed Messrs. Flavell, Davidson and Murray, whose resignations a couple of weeks ago made such a "hubbub."

Dr. Beattie Nesbitt, M.L.A., Claude Macdonald, M.P., and the other city members were at the buildings yesterday, presumably in connection with the appointments.

When seen by The World last night, Chairman McNaught said he had been asked by the government to accept the position of chairman and had accepted. "What will the policy of the new board be?"

Mr. McNaught, chairman of the new commission, needs no introduction to the people of Toronto, and is, perhaps, best known for his valuable services to the city as president of the industrial exhibition board. He is a successful business man and president of the American Watch Case Co. in relation he is a Baptist, and is a prominent member of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association.

It is safe to say that no gentleman in Toronto is more highly esteemed in the city than Mr. McNaught.

Dr. R. J. Wilson, 20 West Bloor-street, is a brother of the well-known divine, Reverend W. F. Wilson, and is a native of Toronto. He is not an active politician in the real sense of the word, tho in 1902 he supported G. F. Marter against Dr. Beattie Nesbitt, because he believed the former had been elected by the party. He upheld the latter in the subsequent election in North Toronto. His principles stand as a moral question, and he is a Methodist and has not taken any active part in municipal politics. He can be depended upon as a non-partisan official.

An Ex-Alderman. Daniel J. Defoe is in Belleville in the year 1835, receiving his education at the public and high schools, and later in Albert College. After spending three years in the study of law, he came to Toronto, in 1837, and in May, 1864, passed his final examination. In June, 1864, Mr. Defoe entered into partnership with Lawrence Heydon, continuing until 1869, when the partnership was dissolved. Mr. Heydon retired in 1882. In 1882 Mr. Defoe was appointed by the city council to the real estate and in the same year was elected to the city council from Ward Six, which he represented for six years. In 1885 Mr. Defoe contested unsuccessfully, the majority of the late E. F. Clarke and Ellis Rogers. In the same year he was appointed by the city council to adjust the differences which then existed between the C.P.R., the G.T.R., the city and a number of private parties, with reference to an alternative site for the land then held by the first named railway, between Yonge and York-streets. The work of adjusting the varied interests was carried out to the satisfaction of all the rival parties. In 1888 Mr. Defoe was appointed a member of the court of revision, a position he has since occupied with credit to himself. In religion he is a Roman Catholic.

CLAIMS LANDS IN EGYPT THAT ARE WORTH MILLIONS Washington, D.C., Dec. 7.—The senate today passed a resolution introduced by Senator Lodge, requesting the president, if not incompatible with the public interests, to make public the papers relating to a claim of Cope Whitehouse to certain desert lands in Egypt. It is represented that the lands claimed are now valued at \$25,000,000.

SAKHAROFF WAS CRUEL COSSACKS RAN LOOSE

At One Place Peasants Had Beards Pulled Out by Drunken Soldiers.

St. Petersburg, Dec. 6.—Via Edinburg, East Prussia, Dec. 7.—The news of the assassination of Lieut.-Gen. Sakharaoff, former minister of war, who was shot three times and instantly killed in the governor's palace at Saratoff, in Southeast Russia, on Monday last, had been preceded by the most horrible stories in the manner in which Sakharaoff had been representing the agrarian disorders. He carried the peasants with the soldiers' whips. In so doing Sakharaoff had been the system adopted by Prince John Obolensky, former governor of Finland, in suppressing the agrarian disorders in the province of Finland.
