Less Than Half Million Separates Actual Total From Objective Now.

### TRAVELERS' BIG BOOST

O. C. T. A. Takes \$25,000 Block in New War Loan Issue Today.

London's Victory Loan total went rocketing up Monday when the team of workers turned in \$25,000 and a day's work. This boosted the city's total to \$4,000,000, and the team are out to make a grandstand finish, and are working hard to make London's share in the loan a big one. The county workers are beginning to hum round now that the snow is on the ground. The amount of the loan is \$100,000,000, making the county of Middlesex total \$1,127,450.

Today the Ontario Commercial Travelers' Association brought the objective still nearer by taking out bonds to the extent of \$8,000 of the new issue. The new money, the remainder being part of former loans.
