Clam Chowder.

Remove the heads from 4 cups of

clams and chop. Parboil 4 cups of

potatoes. Cook 1-2 cupful chopped onions

with 1-2 cupful salt pork cubes

for 10 minutes. Arrange clams, po-

tatoes, onions and salt pork in layers

in the kettle. Add 2 cupful boiling

water and cook slowly until tender.

Add 2 tablespoonful butter, add 2

tablespoonful flour, add 4 cupful milk

and boil three minutes; add fish mixture,

season with salt and pepper.

Serve hot.

Cocoanut Cakes.

Cream 1-4 pound butter with 4 ounces

sugar and beat in 8 eggs alternately,

with 2 ounces flour.

Add 6 ounces chopped cocoanut, 1

egg whipped cream, and 1 teaspoonful

vanilla extract. Bake in small buttered

tins. When ready and cold dip the

top of cakes in stiffly whipped cream

and sprinkle with cocoanut.

At the Camera Club

The sixth salon and eighteenth annual

exhibition of the Toronto Camera

Club which opened at the new club-

rooms, 2 Gould-street, on Monday, will

delight lovers of the artistic all this

week.

The judges this year have been J. W.

Beattie, O.S.A.; C.M. Manly, O.S.A.; and

J. Kennedy, and their selective discrim-

ination has been unusually severe, out of

215 prints submitted only 82 finding

a place on the walls. The result is that

there is little for the critic to find fault

with in the individual prints, either in

point of technique or expression.

Two points may be noted, however.

In the first place, there is a comparatively

restricted range in the media employed.

Toned bromides have by far the

largest showing. Some magnificent

examples of the medium are shown, but

with exception in lamp black. One may

be tempted to ask why the splendid

possibilities of the pigment as burnt

umber or vandyke red have been neg-

lected.

Platinum is represented by only four

prints, and the incomparably soft rich-

ness of the carbon process is not rep-

resented at all.

The other point is a certain restric-

tion in the choice of subject. Several

fertile fields have been left almost un-

touched, notably that of interiors, which,

with the exception of M. O. Ham-

mond's "Evening," by W. H. Moss, which

is really fine, and Newton McTavish's "The

Chapel, Trappist Monastery, Oka," an

admirable achievement. Another

platinum print, "The Scenery of the Awe-

inspiring kind, rushing rapids, water-

falls with their subtle nuances of light

and shade playing across the face of

the rocks, is a fine example of the

watercolor of the pool below, or the tower-

ing grandeur of mountains.
