VANCOUVER'S STAKE LIST

New-Running Horse Track Opens Next Month for 31 Days.

VANCOUVER, July 10.—The stake list for the first race meeting at the new New Island racetrack, under the auspices of the British Columbia Thoroughbred Association, has been announced. The meeting will start on a week longer than originally intended and will be the thirty-one actual racing days between opening, Aug. 21, and closing day, on Saturday, Sept. 25. During that time there will be distributed the stakes the sum of \$7000, while the daily purse will aggregate about \$25,000. There are eleven races in the stake list, three valued at \$1000 apiece and the rest worth \$500 each.
