the fellowship of his Spirit, and the sympathy and support of every true-hearted and right-minded member of our Church, than the usurped dominion of carnal elements and the superstitions of a "Ritnal touch," by emblems of barbaric show against the energy of the Crown.

What his Lordship says about your having suffered much through the neglect and inefficiency of your ministers, their imperfect teaching and disinclination to labor, I shall not condescend to answer, leaving you to jndge whether such statements are true or not.

Trusting that we will all be found faithful in our allegiance to the Crown, and, above all, to the chief Shepherd and Bishop of our souls, and be ever ready to give a willing obedience in all things lawful and honest, to those whom He may set over us in spiritual things.
