BACKUS INTERESTS MEET OPPOSITION

Ontario Publishers Ask Ontario Government to Refuse Further Concessions.

CHARGE UNFAIRNESS

Ottawa, June 3.—The announcement in the press tonight that the Backus interests at Fort Frances have applied to the Ontario government for additional pulp leases and power concessions aroused a storm of protest from the publishers of Ontario daily newspapers, who are in Ottawa this week endeavoring to prevent the diversion of their newspaper supplies to the United States.
