"L' Gabriele D'Annunzio first legionary of the legion, proclaim the Italian regency of Quarnero. I swear on this sacred banner of youth, on this relic of hero c blood, and on my scul, that I will continue to fight with every force and every arm, until my last breath, against everybody and everything, that this Italian soil may forever be united to Italy." torever be united to Italy."

D'Annunzio addressed his soldiers and crizens before taking the oath, asking them if they desired to adopt the new constitution, which, he said, he was obliged to submit to them before Soutember 12 owing to cortain fore September 12, owing to certain news he had received from Paris The populace received the announce-ment with affirmative applause.


