Where the Fighting Will Be Fiercest in the Blank Cartridge Combat To-Morrow.

The "march past" of the corps engaged in the Thanksgiving manoeuvres will take place, it is announced by Col. Otter, in the northwest section of High Park. There is a fairly large level stretch of open ground there, which has been used in past years for like purposes. Col. Otter states that the proceedings will begin at 4 p.m., or possibly a little earlier. Those who are wishful of seeing the soldier boys on parade after the rifle drill, will find themselves within about ten minutes' walk of the scene by taking the normal approach to High Park.

Arrangements for the sham battle on Thanksgiving Day are now complete. The manoeuvres and the rifle drill of the respective corps are in the hands of the officers commanding, and how they will develop is a matter for the actions of the forces and the judges to decide. Toronto is to be attacked from the west. The attacking force will consist of the 18th and 91st regiments and a detachment of the Queen's Own Rifles.

The 18th will leave Hamilton at 5.30 and will be met at Mimico by the Queen's Own Rifles. The 91st will leave at 9 o'clock and will get off at Mimico to act as a reserve force to the attacking corps.

The full fury of the fray will no doubt take place along the banks of the Humber between Lambton Mills and Humber Bay. While the attacking party is marching from Mimico to the Humber, the defending party will be sending out patrols and scouts from its headquarters near High Park. The high bluffs near the Humber will be the scene of the fighting. The bridges at Lambton and Bloor street will come actively into the fight. The ridges along the old belt line will no doubt be contested and considerable military activity may be expected between Bloor street and the Lakeshore road, especially in the vicinity of Eglinton.

It is difficult to advise where best the fight may be seen from, as so much depends upon which force gains the points of advantage first. Anywhere along the Humber banks near Bloor street or Eglinton should be a good place to witness the infantry attack and artillery duel.

Gen. Lake, chief of staff, Ottawa, will witness the review.

AMERICAN FEDERATION OF LABOR New Orleans Labor Body Censured for Boycotting Paper

San Francisco, Nov. 15.—The convention of the American Federation of Labor to-day voted against a proposition to make the two Saturdays falling during the fortnight session half holidays. The report of the executive council cited a long list of disputes between the union and employers, and the merits of the convention were gone into.

Some of the principal contentions referred to were those between the Longshoremen and Seamen's unions, which the executive council, at its recent meeting, recommended be discussed in the present session, and the dispute between the brewery workers and the International Association of Firemen and Engineers, which the council recommended be submitted to a special committee of two members from each union involved, and a like number of representatives from the American Federation of Labor. It was also recommended that most of the trouble between these organizations, arose from the brewery workers' refusal to recognize the International Association of Firemen and Engineers, and the American Federation of Labor.

The central labor body which came in for censure of the executive council was that of New Orleans. The latter organization boycotted a union labor paper because of an expression of opinion. This was styled by the committee as a violation of a free press and a refusal to attend to the matter. The New Orleans body was given three days in which to remove the boycott or the alternative of having its charter revoked. Unions everywhere were urged to be more conservative in their unfriendly list. It was recommended that such cases be referred to the federation, which would then thoroughly investigate the boycott.

The situation in Colorado was referred to as "boycotting" and "denial of aid" was expressed to aid the Western Federation of Miners, both morally and financially, in efforts to have the matter brought before the highest court in the land for final adjudication. The report, concluded by urging the union men to work persistently to the end that an anti-injunction bill, eight-hour law, and measures to unite miners, labor and enforce Chinese exclusion might be passed by congress.

At the afternoon session Michael Davitt made a short speech, expressing his sympathy with organized labor, and was loudly applauded.
