YELLOW FEVER

New Orleans is Convinced That the Disease is Checked In That City and Regards the Situation as Encouraging.

NEW ORLEANS, Aug. 22.—With the fever checked in the city, and plans under way to prevent further re-infection from the country, the local situation is still encouraging. Of the new disease centers eight are above Canal street, one is in Rosa Park, a fashionable residence park opening into St. Charles avenue, a well known citizen and member of Governor Blanchard's staff being the victim. Another case is at a boys' college far down town, one of the employes being stricken."
