

North Missisquoi Division, No. 63, which had for a length of time ceased working has now formally resigned its Charter. Gore Progressive Division has for the time ceased working but it is hoped will shortly resume operations. St. Michaels Union, No. 14, which did not meet or make returns to the Grand Division for three quarters, has again commenced its meetings. N. Stanbridge Division has been re-organized, Bethel Union, No. 5, and Manningville Hope, No. 22, which twelve months ago I reported as having been re-organized, I regret to state have again gone down. One new Division has been organized, viz., Rising Sun, No. 74, located at Lennoxville, County of Compton. Two Charters have also been issued for organizing new Divisions, one to be located at Rawdon, County of Montcalm, the other at Kinneir's Mills, Township of Leed's, County of Megantic.

According to instructions I communicated the Resolutions of sympathy on the death of President Lincoln to the Cabinet at Washington, through Her Majesty's Representative; and to Mrs. Lincoln through the Consul General of the United States.

The correspondence is herewith submitted. \*

Financially our position is somewhat better than at last Annual Session. At that time we were indebted in the sum of \$100, it is now reduced to \$60, and against this has to be placed the indebtedness of Subordinate Divisions amounting to over \$40.
